Krapp's Last Tape, which just finished a run starring John Hurt at the Brooklyn Academy of Music's Harvey Theater, is about mortality and regret of love sacrificed in youth, a longing for things lost in the past. Maloof promises to deliver big in a performance fed by his deep passion for theater and long-time commitment to his craft.

"Actors love doing Beckett," says **Maloof**. "He combines pathos and absurdity in a way that challenges both the actor and the audience."

Louis Maloof is an ad-man turned actor and a creative thinker who invests much in his community of Chatham. Close to 13 years ago, he and his wife Carole decided to open their home and host a series of fundraisers involving theater and musical productions to benefit local charities that were close to their hearts, such as the Cape Cod Commercial Hook Fishermen's Association.

"He and Carole know how to unite the arts and charity communities and provide a unique theater experience with a meaningful contribution to a non-profit like ours."
